COMMENDATIONS

The Perry Elementary Title 1 Team has done an outstanding job meeting students where they are at, to ensure that students have access to interventions that meet their specific needs. This year we have had 28 GEI meetings to review students who are struggling to meet standards in the classroom. In nearly every meeting, the Title 1 team has attended and shared the student's individual Title Profile that outlines what skills the student has, areas where they are lacking, and details about the specific interventions and instruction they have received. The Title 1 teachers' willingness to adjust instruction, shuffle groups, and adapt to meet the needs of all learners ensures that all students have access to high quality interventions. In addition, the Title 1 teachers have been instrumental in supporting classroom teachers with the implementation of UFLI

phonics curriculum, and also have subbed in classrooms countless times already this year. Their initiative to support students and their colleagues is greatly appreciated, and the Title 1 teachers are an asset to Perry Elementary!
